My wife, Roslyn Kuzmich, is a veteran indexer/extractor of 10 plus years doing Polish extractions from Polish Church records from the 1600's to the 1900's in difficult cursive Latin manuscript. Her first experiences with the 1950 census were **"Wow"** in that it is so easy because the *Artificial Intelligence* takes all the guesswork out of indexing. And yes, it can even be very addicting even on a smartphone. My entire ward (congregation), the Foothills Ward, is indexing the 1950 census with the Elders Quorum, Relief Society and Youth. Sister Helen Grau had serious doubts on her ability to index and now she is literally rocking as fast as she can race to the pulpit to share her testimony!!! The missionaries are also bringing two investigators interested in family history. There's no better, direct or faster way for individuals to become active in their family history than through indexing. And the Foothills Ward will be blessed in this unique "Gathering of Israel."

Below is an example of the cursive handwriting from Poland that is rather neat and relatively easy to index using Polish letters in Latin if you are familiar with Polish names with Polish alphabet and then an example from the 1950 Census that is pristine to index with the Artificial Intelligence component within the purple box giving you the answers for your verification with a total five responses that you need to confirm only one of them. Now you understand and appreciate Roslyn's **"Wow"** response between the first three images cited below!
