

Solutions with **FamilySearch.com, Ancestry.com** and **MyHeritage.com** are all in abundance which makes indexing the 1950 Federal Census a fantastic opportunity 1) to research your ancestor's residences and 2) a develop an index that can benefit many, many others for generations to come technology enhancements.

Daniel Horowitz, a genealogy expert for **MyHeritage** offers a latest update for us all. "I'm proud to share that the third installment of the indexed 1950 U.S. Census records are now live on MyHeritage, this time from Alaska, New Hampshire, and the U.S. Virgin Islands. Last week, we released indexed records for Wyoming, Delaware, Vermont, and American Samoa. Today, an additional 763,697 were added for a total of 1,847,635 records in the 1950 U.S. Census Index."
