The SLC Family History Library houses the largest collection of genealogical materials in the world. Their collection consists of books, periodicals, maps, pedigree charts, CD-ROMs, microfilms, and microfiche pertaining to genealogical and historical research that will help bring your ancestors and their stories to life. Below is a synopsis of all of their specialized services that are offered there!
