Most videos are available about 2 weeks following the conference. There is no option for download of these videos.

Session recordings will begin posting 10-15 days after the conference. You will receive an email alerting you when the videos are available to view. Simply log in to the Virtual Pass page, and select the sessions you want to watch.

Access Content When You Want

You will have playback access for 12 months from the date the videos post. Watch and rewatch as many times as you'd like!

Benefits for Attending RootsTech Conference(s) "Live" or "Visually"

The caveat for attending RootsTech 2020 conference either live or virtually is that the presentations are cutting-edge. There are thousands of people who applied to present at each conference and only the best of the best presentations are presenting. One thing that I have found is that when you attend a particular clinic session that is very important for you, you will also learn how to contact the presenter by email. I have found that these clinicians can open windows of opportunities for your research and/or recommend choice resources for you if you know who they are and how to contact them. power of this conference going far beyond the “live” or “recorded” presentations but equally as important for networking avenues for future references and motivation. For example, last year I attended to workshops on doing Chinese research. One of the clinicians was very open to helping my very dear friend, **Lily of China**, who you have already read her testimony in an earlier presentation on this Facebook group at [A Chinese Family History Testimony Experience](#): see August 5 posting to learn how Lily researched her family roots to nearly 600 years ago to the Ming Dynasty of the late 1400’s.



Please read her heart-warming story of how I and others have opened up doors that were beyond her imagination and she learned more Chinese research information from Americans living in Phoenix, Arizona and Denver than she learned on doing family history from anybody in China out of 1.4 million people! That’s just but one example of what can happen when you have connectivity with experts. If you have any inclination to attend, I strongly suggest you peruse the recorded workshops that are presently available online for FREE from all the conferences from 2015 through 2019 at <https://www.rootstech.org/video-archive>. Be prepared for the gamut of your imagination in learning more about the temple and family history than you’ve ever could have imagined if conduct your research without these resources and expert assistance in the field.
