7. Posting family stories and historical documents to your Family Tree.

9. Seeking assistance in doing original research in the USA, Canada and Mexico as well as over 150 countries worldwide as the Internet is a powerful research tool worldwide.
10. Meeting and networking with our trained Temple and Family History consultants.
11. Learning best practices for promoting family history in your family activities
12. Having your Family Tree analyzed by consultants on setting up priorities for improving it.
13. Learn how to network with extended family members
