RootsTech first launched in 2011 with 3,000 attendees in which I both attended and presented and then grew to [32,000 in 2020, with thousands more who participated via livestream.](#) In 2021, the first year the event went all virtual, that attracted [more than 1 million](#)

visitors from 240 countries and territories. The 2022 attendances has still not be announced yet, but still tallying data, and will share more but we had over 700,000 registrants from 228 unique countries and territories this year. Our total participation exceeded 14,000,000 people and continues to grow.
