Proposed 500% Fee Increases for U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services: Here Are Four Alternatives for Accurately Locating International Family Roots

The U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS) which is part of the Department Homeland Security (DHS) is proposing a nearly 500% **increase** in fees for record searches and records provided through its **Genealogy** Program. A search to determine what records are held would **increase** from \$65 to \$240, and for copies of **paper** records from \$65 to \$385. Click <u>here</u> for details.

This pricing increase is outrageous. But that's not all the bad news. For example, a one year, all-access subscription to **Ancestry**, arguably the biggest genealogy repository in the world costs \$389. For that, you get 24-hour-a-day access to billions of records from all over the world for as many ancestors as you're willing to search. Department of Homeland Security's proposal can eventually cost more than one and a half times that for one family member's immigration record. Genealogy has been and will continue to be one of the largest crowdsourcing history programs in the world. Those of us who collect our families' history contribute to the historical record on many levels -- local, regional, national and global, do have other alternatives to obtaining information for establishing their international roots outside of the USA. The dilemma is accurate records are needed to establish the specific geographical fixes for ones ancestors. U.S. Citizenship and Immigration records can be important but there are four work-arounds to firmly establish your heritage family roots of origin that can be significant less expensive than what the DHS is proposing.

First Alternative to U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services for Locating International Records

If you are not positive about the location of your immigrate ancestors, it is highly recommended that you do your U.S. research first so you know more about their specific location(s) from the other continents. Hopefully the previous two vital record postings of December 27th, We All Need Records of our Ancestors for Accurate Genealogical Accountability, and 29th, Free Websites for Vital Records: They Do Exist!!!, offer reasonably inexpensive options for obtaining vital records. And at more affordable pricings. The most comprehensive vital records will be from each state's vital records. Don't let their cost have you hesitating since they are the most abundant collections of vital records available. But also don't neglect the free websites as well since they are readily available on-line to peruse on your computer at your convenience.
